Ministers in the Yukon

Minister Ya'ara Saks came to the Yukon in early July. As Minister for Mental Health and Addictions, the trip was focused on her files:

- We held two roundtables as consultation for the Youth Mental Health Fund, that was announced in Budget 2024. It was a great opportunity to hear directly from youth and leaders working on the ground.
- We saw federal funds in action at K'äjit-Zho, the Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in Youth Centre, in Dawson City. This space gives youth access to crucial mental health support.
- In Whitehorse, we visited Blood Ties Four Directions, and visited their supervised consumption site that provides critical care and naloxone kits. It's saving lives amidst a toxic illegal drug supply.
- We also met with both Kwanlin Dün First Nation and Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in First Nation. It was great to hear and see first hand the important work in health and wellness First Nations are doing.

In mid-August, Minister Anandasangaree accepted my invitation to join me in the Yukon. As Minister of Crown-Indigenous Relations, we met with several Yukon First Nations:

- I appreciated the Minister's visit to Mayo, where he met with Chief Hope and the Council of the First Nation of Nacho Nyak Dun.
- I was pleased with the time spent with the Teslin Tlingit Council, Kwanlin Dün First Nation, and Little Salmon/Carmacks First Nation.
- The opportunity to discuss crucial issues such as MMIWG and Residential School Funding with the Minister was invaluable.

We also had the chance to witness the important work being undertaken by the Council of Yukon First Nations and visited their Family Preservation Centre, which is currently being constructed by Walker Home Construction.
