Canada Highlights Significant Funding to Unlock More Critical Minerals

Development in the Yukon

I'm absolutely thrilled to share that we've announced a total investment of over \$39.9 million for pre-feasibility activities to advance a 765 km, 200 kV high-voltage direct current transmission line network.

This network would link up the Yukon electrical grid to the North American grid in BC. This investment was made possible through the Critical Minerals Infrastructure Fund (CMIF)—a standout initiative under the Canadian Critical Minerals Strategy.

Together, we're blazing a trail toward a sustainable energy future!

Canada invests over \$502.3 Million to Boost Research and Innovation

Canada's outstanding researchers and institutions are at the forefront of science and innovation, and play a crucial role in shaping a stronger, healthier, and more resilient country.

As part of Budget 2024, the federal government unveiled a package of measures worth over \$4.6 billion to strengthen Canadian research and innovation, including \$825 million over five years to increase support for master's and doctoral students.

Earlier this month, \$502.3 million was distributed across the country to support to over 6,900 researchers and research projects across the country.

Parliamentary Secretary Rob Oliphant's recent visit was a success!



Canada announces new support for global polio eradication efforts

Canada is increasing its commitment to eradicating polio with a \$151 million investment announced by Minister Ahmed Hussen at the Rotary International conference in Toronto. This funding will support the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) and partners like UNICEF and WHO, aiming to vaccinate over 370 million children annually, particularly in vulnerable and conflict-affected areas.

This is great news - something that I and many Yukoners have long advocated for, through the Rotary Club of Whitehorse Rendezvous!
