#### \$6 Billion Radar Partnership with Australia

Canada will partner with Australia to develop Over-the-Horizon Radar technology, boosting Arctic security with advanced surveillance and threat detection capabilities. This collaboration supports the NORAD modernization plan.


#### \$420 Million Investment in Military Presence

An investment of nearly \$420 million will expand Canada's military presence in the Arctic, with increased training, personnel, and operations to protect the North year-round.

#### \$253 Million for Nunavut's Economy

Over \$253 million will be invested in Nunavut's infrastructure, including upgrades to power plants, housing improvements, and the development of a hydroelectric facility to create jobs and ensure energy security.

# The governments of Canada and Yukon finalize a ten-year agreement for the Canada Housing Infrastructure Fund

I'm excited to announce that the Governments of Canada and Yukon have finalized a 10-year agreement under the Canada Housing Infrastructure Fund, investing \$98.9 million to enhance critical infrastructure in our communities—drinking water, wastewater, stormwater, and solid waste systems. This collaboration will help us build more homes, faster, and tackle the growing demand for affordable housing across the Yukon.

## More healthy meals for kids in the Yukon

We're investing \$7.4 million over the next three years into the National School Food Program in the Yukon. With this program, we are ensuring our students have the healthy meals they need to focus, learn, and grow. This is in addition to the federal government's \$10-a-day childcare program which saves Canadian families \$16,200 each year, making childcare more affordable and easing the pressure on parents. This month, we announced a five-year extension agreement for the Canada-Yukon Early Learning and Child Care Agreement. This agreement will provide the Yukon with approximately \$74 million to expand access to affordable childcare, giving families the support they need while helping parents, especially moms, get back to work.
